Another Successful Semester for Delta Psi

Greetings from Delta Psi! After the end of the Fall 2012 semester, we have a natural opportunity to reflect on our successes to-date, as well as ways we can improve moving forward. Once again, Delta Psi was a leader in Greek recruitment with another 20+ member pledge class, resulting in the recent initiation of 23 new Sigma Chi's. The subsequent initiation banquet was well attended by parents, actives, and alumni alike, with a turnout of more than 120 people. Special thanks should be given to Magister Nick Fortune '13, Ritual Chair Ben Richardson '15, and Assistant Ritual Chair Will Nobile '15, and all participating actives for performing yet another Jay Cady '12, Chuck Carletta '12, and superb initiation.

In addition to the "regular" workload given out by RPI, our actives have stayed busy and involved on campus and in the community. To date, Delta Psi actives have racked up over 700 hours of community service, participating in events such as our annual haunted house and leaf rake, a blood drive, and IFC sponsored community service events. As the semester drew towards its close, our newest class of initiates decided to set a new example of pledge-class charity, and ran a "holiday-gram" booth for a week. At the rate of \$1/message, the class was able to raise an impressive \$235, all of which will be donated to charity.

We continued our active involvement in the Inter-Fraternal Council in the
