Like the rest of Derby Days, the purpose of the event was to fundraise for the Huntsman Cancer Foundation to support cancer research.

We are happy to report that the 5K was a success: we had about 80 participants register and raised more than \$2,500 in total, making this our highest fundraising philanthropic event in recent memory. The runners, our Greek Dean Matt Hunt among them, seemed to all enjoy the unique course and competed fiercely for the top places and prizes.
