#### Sigma Chi Wins Chapter of the Year

On a beautiful Saturday afternoon in May, the brothers of Phi Sigma Kappa hosted the annual Rensselaer Greek Awards Ceremony in their recently acquired church-turned-fraternity-house. In front of Greek representatives, chapter advisors, and members of Rensselaer's faculty and staff, the undergraduate President of PSK exclaimed that they were "damn proud... to have come to where [they] are today." By the end of the day's proceedings, they would not be the only organization to have claim to that sentiment.

In an exceedingly notable performance, Delta Psi took home *seven* of the day's categorical awards, which spanned all facets of chapter operations: Personal Development, Ritual, Membership Recruitment and Development, Leadership Development, Campus Involvement, Chapter Standards and Membership Accountability, and Greek Relations. The chapter was also an honorable mention in the Housing category. For perspective, the next highest performing organization received only two categorical awards.

In this case seven awards were not enough— Sigma Chi was awarded **The President's Cup** for the first time since its adoption, along with the title of

Chapter of the Year. Additionally, Delta Psi maintained its status as a 5-Star Chapter for the third year in a row. This is an accomplishment that deserves to be applauded. It not only reveals the strength of our brotherhood, but also the outstanding support of our alumni. It is also tribute to the efforts of all brothers to help raise our chapter from good to great, and for that commitment we are extremely grateful. (Cont. on Page 2)

#### Campus Spotlight—WRPI

Working at WRPI is an honor and a fulltime volunteer position. WRPI is not only a full-scale radio station with a 75-mile broadcast radius, but also a Union organization which possesses over 60 active members as well as the largest budget of any Union-funded organization. As Chief Engineer and a member of WRPI's executive committee, my position deals with the repair of WRPI equipment and the representation of WRPI in the Union. One of the Chief Engineer's most important assets is the tech department, which is "on call" at any moment. WRPI's tech department currently consists of 2 members: EE Kate Marciano '13 and Systems Engineer Dan Weeks '11 (current employee at Computational Center for Nanotechnology Innovations).

To avoid service interruptions, most tech work is performed during "Tech Time," taking place on Saturday evenings after station hours. In addition to Tech Time, weekly meetings are held to discuss problems, upgrades, and work schedules for the next Tech Time. Current projects include broadcast digitalization, installation of a GPS synchronized clock system, and a \$110K fundraising effort to replace WRPI's aging transmitter and upgrade the tower site.
