Winter Weather Doesn't Delay Construction of Pomeroy Chapter House

Work on the Pomeroy Chapter House is progressing well and is on schedule in spite of some winter storms. By March, the new structure should be fully framed and closed in with temporary heat so that work

can continue without significant weather impacts. Meanwhile, work has begun on the installation of the critical systems: HVAC, fire protection, electrical, and plumbing. The steel stairs in the two new stair towers were installed during the week of January 14. With special help (including the provision of cable and networking equipment) from Bill Pomeroy '66 and his company, CXtec, we are installing a state-of-the-art, high-speed and high-capacity wired/wireless network, matching or surpassing anything currently available to other fraternities.

You may notice a few other important features of the renovation. The first is the relocation of the driveway to the north side (toward campus, and on the right as you are looking at the house from the street). This will move noise away from the Bell's property (on the south side where the Lewises used to live), and provide better truck access for delivery and dumpster pick-up. It is also a part of the significant expansion of the parking area to accommodate over 40 cars.

The second thing you may have noticed from the pictures is the masonry stair towers at the rear corners of the house, with the steel stairs being installed. This will provide a fire-resistant escape route from all four levels of the structure. Once construction is finished, the exterior will look like the rest of the original house. It will then be sheathed in shingles and clapboard to be consistent with the classic Victorian architecture of the

main house.

In March, we'll see the completion of the major systems, siding, and porches. In April, wall and ceiling insulation will be completed and interior wallboard installed, with finish work in earnest during May.

Special thanks go to John Pfaff '71 for heading the team to select the new kitchen appliances, Eric Pulvino '09 for designing the house communications network, and to Larry Frey '71 for his efforts in leveraging his business connections to achieve thousands in cost savings for the procurement of electrical and plumbing equipment.

Pinewoods Educational Foundation Plans for the Future

Alumni Focus on Programming for 2013-14 School Year and Beyond

With *The Campaign for ΣXcellence* exceeding its stretch goal, raising over \$1.5 million, and the Pomeroy Chapter House renovation well on its way, the Pinewoods Educational Foundation (PEF) is now focusing on its educational mission. As an IRS 501(c)(3) designated entity, and with the tax advantaged status, there comes an educational responsibility. As stated in the Charter of the Foundation, "The Pinewoods Educational Foundation is organized and shall be operated exclusively for charitable, educational, and scientific purposes within the meaning of Sections 501(c)(3) of the IRS Code." This provision was required in our application to the IRS in order to ensure that we are engaged in more than simply trying to get around IRS regulations that normally do not allow fraternal house corporations to be tax exempt.

We began last year to meet these responsibili-

ties by providing scholarships and grants both to deserving active brothers and to the fraternal organization on campus with the highest overall G.P.A. ranking. In addition, we held our first oncampus educational session with Brothers Bill Pomeroy '66, Robert Bedard '75, and me leading a seminar on entrepreneurial career paths.

Next year we intend to significantly expand the scope of such education-related offerings, and we are forming a program planning committee that is being charged to develop a detailed calendar of activities for the 2013-14 school year similar to the seminar we led last year. In addition to programs focused on entrepreneurial development, we intend to have programs focus on topics such as the legal profession (Larry Mentz '68 and Foss Hooper '66 are taking the lead), sustainability, and other areas of interest. Our goal is to publish our calendar and have it

available in a marketing-oriented format for recruitment activities at the start of the 2013-14 school year.

This is a call to anyone who is interested in getting involved and helping develop the Foundation's educational programs. Whether you are interested in helping out and developing one of the above mentioned topics, or you have a totally new idea, let us know of your interest. All we are asking today is for your time.
