
Doug Doskocil '83 Enters the Chapter Eternal

oug Doskocil '83 was the beloved husband of Cynthia J. Weeks; cherished father of Samuel L. Doskocil '18 and Jacob S. Doskocil '19; son of Albert C. and Lois E. (Springsteen) Doskocil; and brother of Susan L. Doskocil, William C. and his wife, Leslie Doskocil, and David B. and his wife, Andrea Doskocil. He is also survived by many nieces, nephews, cousins and in-laws.



He was a graduate of Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute (B.S., electrical engineering, 1983), Tufts University (M.S., electrical engineering, 1986), Suffolk University School of Law (J.D., 1991), and Vermont Law School (M.S.E.L., 1999).
